Philosophy of the IB

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) is a two-year curriculum which prepares students for university. The diploma is recognized globally as a rigorously earned entrance qualification to post-secondary study.

Its central value-based aim is best expressed through the IB mission statement:

The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

To this end the organization works with schools, governments and international organizations to develop challenging programmes of international education and rigorous assessment.

These programmes encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

Uniqueness of the IBDP

You will challenge yourself, in addition to the six subject requirements, through the core three components of the curriculum:

Theory of Knowledge (TOK)


You will develop critical interdisciplinary thinking and investigate how we know what we claim to know in various areas of knowledge.

Extended Essay (EE)

You will develop academic research and writing skills in an area of knowledge of your choice, culminating in a essay.

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

You will develop social and civil relationships with both the local and global communities through service outreach.
